I worked to establish Promise College in southern Syrian which currently serves 1,836 students in a variety of disciplines including, but not limited to, Electrical Engineering, Counseling and Psychology, and Medical Sciences. I also worked with Valparaiso University and SAMS to establish Hope Underground, a 2-year Medical Training Institute in Ghouta, Syria that equips its graduates with the scientific and technical skills to address the shortage of medical personnel in local field hospitals and clinics. In 2017-2018, I established and directed a pilot program providing students inside Syria demonstrating excellent English language skills with an opportunity to pursue a US-accredited degree at an online university based in California. I personally lobbied for funds, worked on applications, enrolled, and mentored 25 students through their courses at the University of the People. In 2018, I successfully submitted a grant proposal to the Syrian-American Engineers Association and received funding to establish an electrical engineering laboratory for our students in Nawa, Daraa. This laboratory will provide our engineering students with the facilities and supplies to carry out experiments, prepare sketches, and test different designs. In 2019-2020, I oversaw the online education of PRHD students via University of the People and led a team of board members, two independent accounting firms, and organization attorneys in a comprehensive ten-year review of PRHD's activities and projects.

I spent February-March in Akleh Hospital in Amman, Jordan volunteering with Dr. Youssef Barakat, a Syrian urologist who spent considerable time working in field hospitals in Ghariya Gharbiya, Daraa, Syria. One wing of the hospital is dedicated to serving Syrian refugees without charge. I dressed wounds, particularly those caused by explosive bullets, took out stitches and catheters, took patient vitals, and disinfected and bandaged amputation sites.
